Food Scrap Recycling

- 1. Food Scrap Recycling Update Jessica Gallagher, Sarah Coccaro
 - a. KLSD Board agreed in principle with locating the food scrap program at the LES.
 - b. KLSD will confirm internally if a formal approval is needed.
 - c. The Town Board is evaluating if a revised RFP for waste hauling is required and will propose to request the funds needed to provide waste hauling from April through December.
