#### I. **MINUTES**

Review and adoption of the Minutes of the ACARC Meeting held on May 11, 2022.

Mr. Ozols made a motion to approve the Minutes of the ACARC meeting held on May 11, 2022, as submitted; seconded by Mr. Mercer; In favor: Rose Bonanno, Darren Mercer and Ed Ozols. Abstain: Chris Winter.

Mr. Winter made a motion to approve the Minutes of the ACARC Meeting held on August 10, 2022, as submitted; seconded by Mr. Mercer; In favor: Darren Mercer, Ed Ozols and Chris Winter. Abstain: Rose Bonanno.

#### II. **DICUSSION**

ACARC and the Comprehensive Plan process – meeting with the Comprehensive Plan consultant

Jonathan Lockman, Nelson Pope Voorhis, was present.

Mr. Lockman shared a Power Point presentation which is attached to these minutes. He noted that a comprehensive plan:

- is required by state law;
- supports the town's zoning ordinance;
- helps attract investment; and
- helps attract future funding opportunities.

Mr. Lockman stated the next steps in the 18-month process include:

- an existing conditions report;
- public outreach (in person/over Zoom/town-wide/hamlet-based);
- the plan undergoes SEQR review; and
- zoning amendments are enacted by the Town Board.

Mr. Lockman stated that all land-use regulations must be in accord with the comprehensive plan and asked that ACARC contact <u>steering@planlewisboro.com</u> when they have ideas on possible changes to the Town Code. He noted the steering committee has a lot of information on the planning process at https://www.lewisborogov.com/cmpsc

Ms. Rendo stated the participation survey is live and available in English and Spanish at <a href="https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/FFHK9N7">https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/FFHK9N7</a> and responda a la encuesta de participación en <a href="https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/6WN6MY8">https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/6WN6MY8</a> She encouraged everyone to respond. She noted there will also be a post card mailing about the current survey and that outreach teams are being developed. Ms. Bonanno noted the survey will also be available at the Library Fair (9/17/22).

Mr. Lockman asked ACARC to consider any specific changes they would like to see in the ACARC-related sections of the Town Code.

Ms. Bonanno asked for more clarity on tree issues.

Mr. Ozols would like ACARC to have more input in character over the town. He noted that residents in the Special Character Districts have well-designed proposals and do a good job respecting their neighbors.

Ms. Conran stated the Waccabuc National Historic District covers a different area than the town's Mead Street Special Character District.

ACARC agreed to develop a list of issues/concerns to share with the consultants, reached consensus that evening Zooms are the best way to meet and will spread the word about the comprehensive planning process.

Ms. Conran will send Jonathan Lockman a tally of recent ACARC applications broken out by referring agency and check if there was a photographic inventory.

ACARC agreed to have another discussion meeting after the members reviewed the ACARC sections of the Town Code and will Zoom on 10/11/22 or 10/12/22 (if there are no applications on the agenda).

# What is A Comprehensive Plan?

Authorized by Town Law 272-a and defined as follows:

"Means the materials, written and/or graphic, including but not limited to maps, charts, studies, resolutions, reports and other descriptive material that identify the goals, objectives, principles, guidelines, policies, standards, devices and instruments for the immediate and long-range protection, enhancement, growth and development of the town located outside the limits of any incorporated village or city."

A document that identifies the goals, objectives, and recommendations (principles, guidelines, policies, standards) to guide immediate and long-range growth, protection, enhancement and development in a Town.

# Why is a Comprehensive Plan Important?

- •"All Town land use regulations must be in accordance with a comprehensive plan" as required by NYS Law.
  - This Comprehensive Plan process will be followed by updates to the Town Code to be consistent with the Plan as applicable and to facilitate the goals of the Plan.
- Proactive vs Reactive- community consensus, leadership, and coordination
  - Investment
  - Development
  - Regulation
- •Clear Comprehensive Plans can attract investment and support future funding opportunities.

Town Board Created Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee.

- Make recommendations to the Town Board in the selection of a planning consultant that will assist in preparing the plan.
- Review documents and information presented by the consultants.
- Provide feedback and ideas on the goals, objectives and recommendations developed throughout the process.
- Contribute to the development of the community engagement process.
- Participate in meetings and workshops.
- Be an advocate for the comprehensive planning process.
- Assist in gathering community input throughout the process.
