1. 2023 Committee Roles

Waste Reduction Initiatives

- 1. Food Scrap Recycling Jessica Gallagher
 - a. Fox Valley and Onatru sites are operational and ready for food scraps.
 - b. Starter kits and additional toters have been ordered.
 - i. Available for purchase through parks and rec or through Town Clerk.
 - c. Tony has requested the facilities department construct platforms for the bins at each drop off location.
- 2. Curbside Compost Pilot Program
 - a. Bedford conducted a small scale pilot program for curbside food scrap collection.
 - b. DEC grant can provide up to 50% of collection costs for food scrap recycling

- 3. Compost give back day
 - a. 20 yards of compost would be delivered. We need to determine the date, drop off location, storage, and method for distribution.
 - i. Opportunity for collaboration with Garden Club on compost distribution
 - ii. Dan Welsh will reach out to the Garden Club to coordinate
- 4. Paintcare Trade-in Program Andrea Rojas
 - a. Primary date: May 6th
 - b. Primary Location: Spring Street Commuter Lot
 - i. Secondary Location: Town Recycling Center
 - c. Dan Welsh will coordinate with Tony to confirm the lot is town property and can be used for the event.

Town Coordination

- 1. Town Recycling Website Bob Karpel
 - a. Two correction need to be made:
 - i. 1st paragraph revise text to say "The Recycling Center will be open on Saturday mornings from 9:00am until noon. Please check the town website to confirm the facility is open."
 - ii. Last paragraph Co-mingled glass, metal, and Plastic (number 1 through 7). Newspapers & magazines can be placed in a separate container. Cardboard should be flattened.
- 2. Town Recycling Costs to the Town Bob Karpel
 - a. eWaste collections pricing has shifted from the vendors due to new law.
 - b. As of last month, the town was not charged for eWaste collection.

 - a. Residents that participated in the solarize campaign 5 years ago noted that the app that reports to the inverter stopped working on Dec 31, 2022 because 3g wireless systems

- were sunsetted by wireless companies. Because of the outage the modem is not reporting the power then the residents. The potential cost to re-install is potentially \$1,200, however the pricing could be negotiated/coupled to be as low as 4 80.
