They're BPI® certified as compostable[1] and meet ASTM D6400 standards for commercial composability[2].
- 4. Over the summer Bedford 2030 supported <u>Sewstainable fashion show</u> and there is a firm called <u>Reloom</u> which employs homeless people to make clothing out of textiles.
