REGISTRATION

Registration for all programs, unless otherwise specified, is **by mail, in person on an official registration form and online via WebTrac**. We cannot accept registrations by phone, email or fax. Incomplete registrations are subject to being returned to sender. We cannot be responsible for lost or misdirected mail. **Any walk in registrations will be processed with the day's mail if received prior to the mail arrival. If received after the day's mail has arrived, it will be processed with the following day's mail.**

PLEASE NOTE: The Department does not confirm registrations by mail. You will only be contacted if there is a problem or the program is cancelled.

REGISTRATION POLICY

Non-residents may sign up for programs one week before the start date when space is available.

CREDIT CARDS

We now accept credit cards. If you have ever registered for a Parks and Recreation program or permit, an account has been set up for you. We will be glad to assist you if help is needed. If you are new to our system, please go to www.lewisbororecreation.com and click on create an account. A 3% service fee will appear as a separate charge from Card Connect on your bank or credit card either with online registration or registration in the office.

REFUNDS/CREDITS

The Town of Lewisboro has a no refund policy. However, a refund/credit will be considered only under the following conditions:

1. A full refund/credit will be given if the program is cancelled by the Parks & Recreation Department prior to the program's start.
2. If a participant moves from Town, a full or pro-rated refund will be made based on the number of sessions the participant attended. Proof of re-location must be presented.
3. If a participant becomes ill or injured, a full or pro-rated refund will be made based on the number of sessions the participant attended. A doctor's medical note must accompany the request.

In addition to the above, a \$25.00 processing fee for all refunds/credits that are approved will be assessed, except for programs cancelled by the Parks & Recreation Department. All refund requests must be made in writing to the Superintendent of Parks & Recreation for consideration. Approved refunds will be paid by Town voucher.

RETURNED CHECKS

If a check is returned to the Parks & Recreation Department for any reason, a cash or money order payment of \$20.00 will be required in order to re-deposit your check and offset the expenses incurred by the Town.

LATE PICK UPS

Subject to all Town of Lewisboro sponsored programs: All participants are expected to be picked up at the assigned program end time. Any and all tardy pickups from programs will result in additional charges to cover the Town's unbudgeted expenses. The town will charge \$20.00 per every 15 minutes per participant of supervision past program end time with the first 15 minutes as a grace period unless the grace period is abused consistently.

PRESERVE / PARK USE REGARDING DOGS

Please be reminded that while dogs are permitted in Town parks and preserves they must be leashed at ALL times and owners are responsible for cleaning up after their dog. **OFF LEASH DOGS ARE NOT PERMITTED** in any of the Town properties. Dogs are **NOT** permitted in any of the playground areas or the pool facility at any time. For safety and sanitary reasons it is requested that dogs not be ran/walked on any of the athletic fields located in the parks.

A FRIENDLY REMINDER

Our Department is asking for assistance and cooperation in helping keep our park facilities and preserves clean for the benefit of all of our patrons and their guests. Please use the trash and/or recycling receptacles provided to dispose of waste and debris. OPEN SPACE AND PRESERVES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Committee advises the Parks and Recreation Department, and upon request, the Town Board on issues relating to open space and preserves. The purpose of the Open Space and Preserves Advisory Committee is to make recommendations to the Town Board regarding opportunities to utilize and preserve open space. The Committee may also research inter-municipal efforts to preserve open space and recommend participation by the Town where deemed appropriate. The Committee members and Lewisboro Trail volunteers are solely responsible to maintain and create new trails in all Town Preserves. The Committee coordinates the implementation of any and all approved preserve management plans and promotes the maintenance, improvement and creation of trails within the preserves. Finally, the Committee has created and updated the mapping system for all Town owned preserves – compatible with the Avenza mapping app for phones.

2024 NEW YEAR'S STORMWATER RESOLUTIONS - FROM THE LEWISBORO STORMWATER COMMITTEE

Please do your part to prevent contaminants from entering our lakes, streams, wetlands, and drinking water via stormwater runoff by making the following resolutions. Phosphorus is the single most important contaminant in our water and if the other nutrients necessary for growth are available, and they usually are, one pond of phosphorus will result in 500 pounds of plant growth. A little goes a long way! Please read the following possible resolutions and commit to doing as many as you can.

- I will check to see when my septic system was last pumped and if it hasn't been done in the last 2 or 3 years (5 years is the legal maximum), I will have it pumped.
- I will use water efficiently so I won't overload my septic system, which can shorten its life.
- I will not use fertilizer containing phosphorous since it is against the law.
- I will use a mulching mower that mulches grass cuttings and leaves while mowing or compost leaves and other yard waste.
- I will cover bare soil with grass seed and mulch to prevent erosion of earth and its associated phosphorus.
- I will pick up after my pets and dispose of their waste in the trash.
- If I live near a lake, stream or wetland, I will plant a native buffer or rain garden to slow the flow of rainwater or storm water. This will allow more water to soak into the ground rather than flow over it carrying pollutants directly into the body of water.
- I will plant native plants which need less water and fertilizer to thrive.
- I will leave the leaves where they fall in wooded areas where they will decompose naturally.
- I will check my car for oil and antifreeze leaks and have any leaks fixed.

PUMP OUT YOUR SEPTIC SYSTEM! IT IS THE LAW!

To protect the quality of the area's drinking water, Westchester County and Lewisboro instituted a septic system inspection requirement in 2011. Septic systems are a source of phosphorus which accelerates plant and algae growth and can kill Lewisboro's lakes and watercourses, destroying much of the scenery that makes our Town such a wonderful place in which to live. This law requires that each septic system be pumped at least once every 5 years. Failure to do so may result in significant fines.

This means that if you haven't had your septic system pumped since 2018, it's time to do so NOW. Many septic systems require pumping more often than every 5 years, depending on usage or condition. Have your septic pumped out this season by an authorized Westchester County septic hauler.

Keep your copy of the septic system inspection report as proof if records get lost. Bureaucracies are not perfect and the report is the only proof that you obeyed the law!

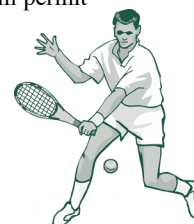

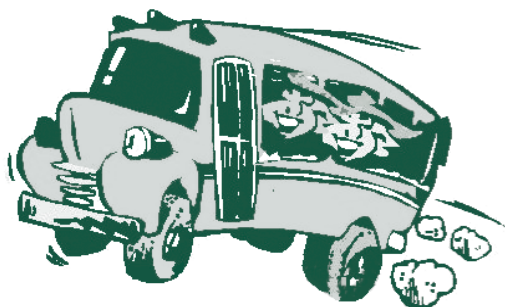

Registration for all Town and School-District residents will begin on **Saturday, February 3rd, 2024** from 10:00AM – 12:00PM at our office located at 99 Elmwood Road, South Salem, NY. We are available for in-person registration Monday – Friday from 9:00AM – 5:00PM, including extra hours on Thursday, February 8th from 5:00PM – 7:30PM.

We will continue to offer online registration for Teen Treks, which will be live at 10:00AM on Saturday, February 3rd. In addition to the online registration, you will need to fill out the necessary paperwork for your camper to be able to attend. This paperwork includes the camper registration form, behavior policy, trip permission form, and a copy of your child's immunizations from their doctor. All forms must be returned to our office **no later than Friday, March 1st**. Space is limited and we anticipate that spots will go even faster this year due to the shift in grades. Please remember there is a 3% service fee for all credit card transactions.

Medical equipment is available for loan including wheelchairs, walkers, canes, bedrails, shower chairs and crutches.

The **“Are You Okay?”** telephone reassurance system is available to all our seniors. Daily telephone calls to each participant are made to ensure an individual is safe and well. Confidentiality is always guaranteed.

The **“File of Life”** is available through the Senior Adult Program and the Outreach Program. It is an informational tool to provide assistance during a medical crisis. Everyone should have one. The large info file attaches to the refrigerator and the small info file belongs in your wallet at all times.

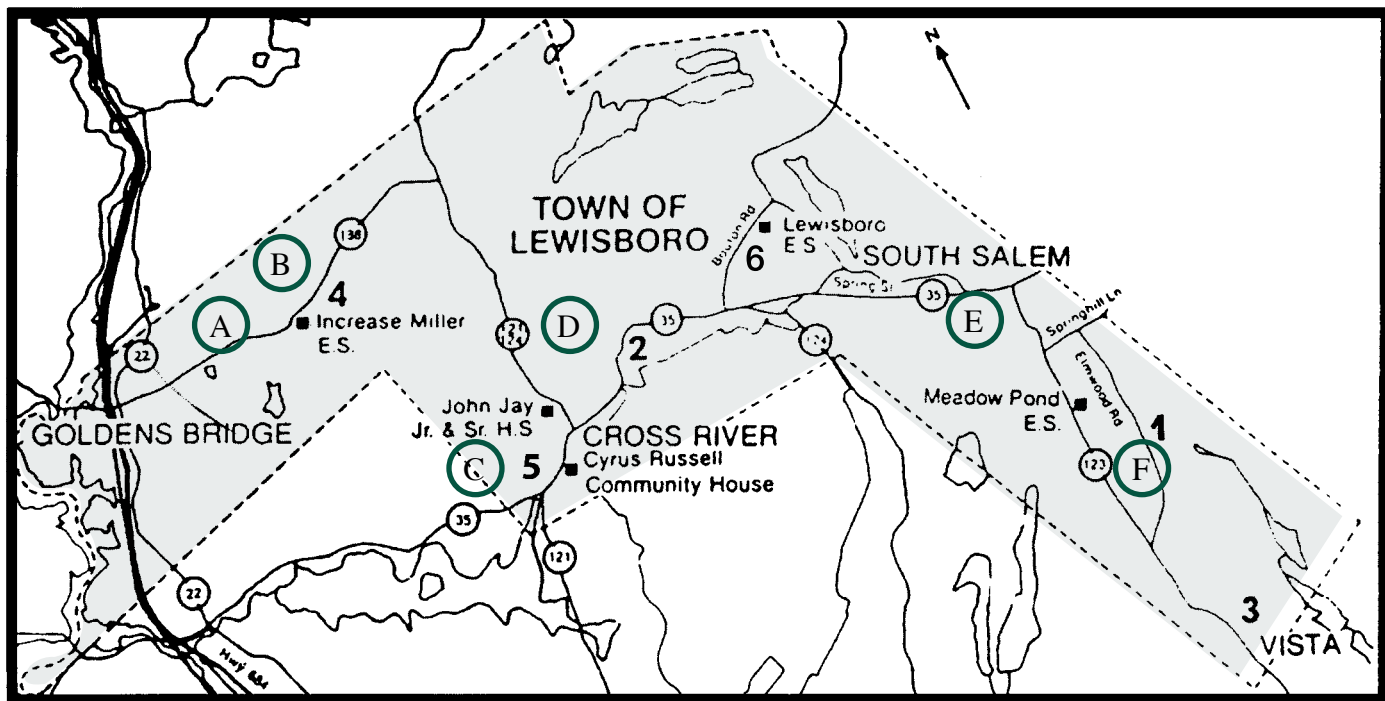
