Town of Lewisboro Resolution in support of New York State Clean Water Grant Funding Whereas, US Environmental Protection Agency(EPA) Reports and NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation(EFC) documents estimate that Wastewater Infrastructure cost needs over the next twenty years are in excess of 30 billion dollars in New York State; and

Whereas, these USEPA Reports and NYS EFC documents further estimate that Drinking Water Facilities Infrastructure cost needs over the next twenty years are also in excess of 30 billion dollars in New York State; and

Whereas, the Construction Industry Council of Westchester and Hudson Valley and the Construction Advancement Institute of Westchester and Mid-Hudson Valley launched a Clean Water/Jobs Coalition campaign and released a report in October of 2016 entitled *The Water Infrastructure GAP for New York State's Future: Clean Water Infrastructure Needs for Communities in Westchester County and the Hudson Valley* which identified over 250 million dollars in current clean water (wastewater and drinking water) infrastructure project needs and a

billion dollars in total clean water infrastructure project needs over the next five years in the local communities of the Westchester/Hudson Valley Region; and

Whereas, investments in clean water infrastructure projects protect our water bodies, purify our drinking water, enhance community quality of life, create thousands of jobs and enhance the local economy; and

Whereas, local municipalities cannot take on this challenge alone and need clean water grants and low-interest financing to make these investments possible; and

Whereas, under the leadership of Governor Cuomo and the State Legislature the *Water Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2015* was enacted and to date has allocated 425 million dollars state-wide in clean water infrastructure grant funds to communities of which 250 million dollars has been awarded including close to 35 million dollars awarded to communities in the Westchester and Hudson Valley region; and

Whereas, this Clean Water grant program will allocate its remaining 175 million dollars in clean water grant funds state-wide in 2017 which will leave a zero balance in the account while many projects have not been funded and the need remains in the billions of dollars;

Whereas, it is critical that the Water Infrastructure Improvement Act be reauthorized and new/increased funds be appropriated state-wide in the NYS 2017-2018 budget in order for communities in Westchester County and across the State of New York to meet their clean water infrastructure needs today and into the future.

Therefore be it resolved that the Town of Lewisboro joins the Clean Water/Jobs Coalition call for Governor Cuomo and the State Legislature to appropriate 800 million dollars in the NYS 2017-2018 Budget for the Clean Water grant program state-wide and in doing so reauthorize the Water Infrastructure Improvement Act.

HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (HAP) - Waive Onatru Fee

Mr. Parsons stated that the Humanitarian Assistance Program would like to use the Onatru Farmhouse for a three day training workshop. HAP provides education for therapists who work with first responders. The dates that they are looking for do not conflict with any other rentals or the Parks and Recreation department.

But if a group has rented several times before he feels some type of a discount should be given. <u>VOLUNTEERS</u> – Thanked

Mr. Pappalardo thanked the numerous volunteers that take part in the many committees in our community. Our town is better because of them.

SOLAR POWER – Update

Mr. Welsh stated that the solarized program that was running a while back around Westchester is a campaign based promotion of solar. The mechanism is that they get local volunteers involved, bids from solar vendors would be obtained so that competitive rates could be fixed for the towns and then a further mechanism to leverage lower prices with every installation sold. The organizer would go out with an RFP with the towns that want to participate. Mr. Welsh stated that this worked pretty well the last time and about 400 new set ups were installed. Mr. Welsh spoke with the towns of North Salem and Pound Ridge and they are interested. It doesn't cost anything to the town to take part in this. A resolution will be needed for this at a future meeting.

TOWN PROPERTY – Tennis Courts

Mr. DeLucia stated that while he likes the idea of putting an open pavilion with solar panels over the tennis courts at Town Park, they started brain storming about other ideas other than tennis courts. Multi games could be played under the pavilion. One idea was pickle ball. Other ideas included ping pong tables, bocce, etc. In the winter time it could possibly be an ice skating rink, etc. Campers and residents would be able to use. It could also be rented out for parties. Mr. DeLucia stated that the cost to repair the tennis courts would be approximately \$200,000 and we already have courts at other Town Parks. Mr. Welsh stated that they could put year round usage as a vision on the application for the solar panels.

The Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee will be involved and will continue to look into this and other ideas.
