
Leon Levy Preserve



The 370 acre Preserve features wetlands rich in wildlife, a ravine with 75 foot cliffs and a diverse hardwood forest. Rare Purple Milkweed and Blue Cohosh plants have been found. Five miles of hiking/horse trails.

In 2005 the Town of Lewisboro purchased this former Bell property. This was made possible by a \$5 million contribution from the Jerome Levy Foundation (Leon Levy was the primary benefactor) and \$500,000 from the Dextra Baldwin McGonagle Foundation.
